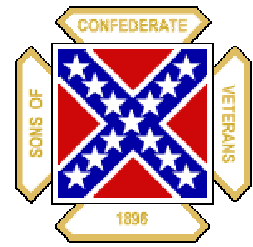

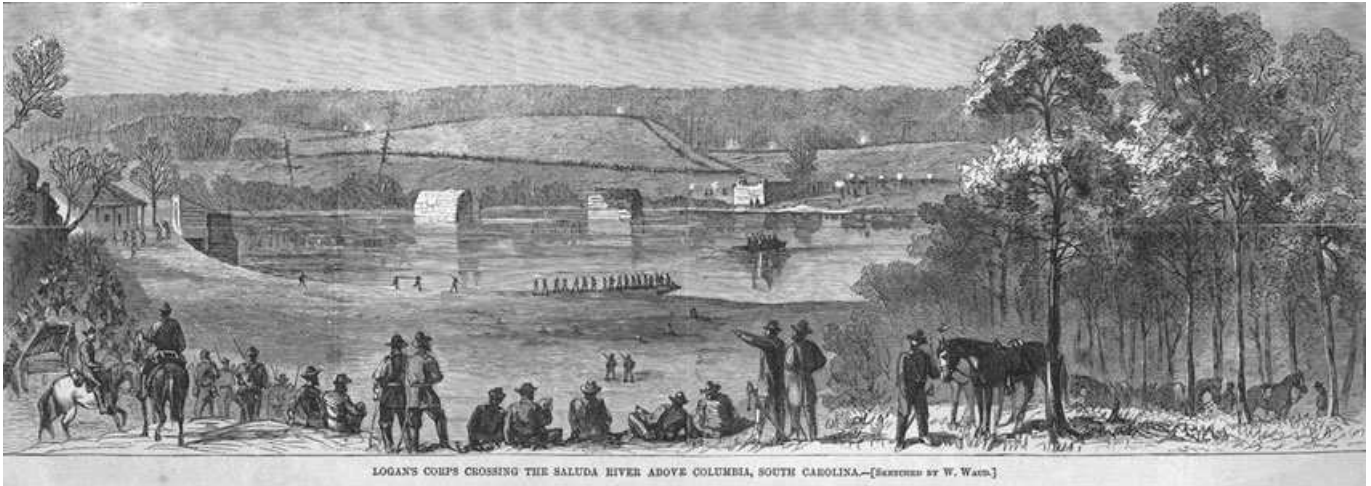

The War Between the States

A war waged from 1861 to 1865 between two organized governments: The United States of America and the Confederate States of America. These were the official titles of the contending parties within the same government. It was not a "War of Secession", for the Southern States seceded without a thought of war. The right of a state to secede had never been questioned. It was not a "War of Rebellion", for sovereign, independent States (co-equal), cannot rebel against each other. It was a War Between the States because twenty-two non-seceding States made war upon eleven seceding States to force them back into the Union of States. It was not until after the surrender of 1865 that secession was decided to be unconstitutional. The Congressional Record of March 2, 1928, reports Senate Joint Resolution Number 41 wherein Congress recognized the title "War Between the States" as proper.

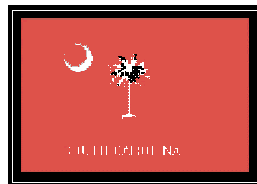
